




## Leaving Cert. Exam and CAO

# What is the Leaving Certificate Applied?



- It is a distinct, self-contained two-year
   Leaving Certificate programme aimed at preparing students for adult and working life
- It emphasises forms of achievement and excellence which the established Leaving Certificate has not recognised in the past

- 2 Year Programme
- Divided into 4 half-year blocks called Sessions
- Key assignments must be completed during each session
- 7 Tasks
- It is continuous assessment- marked over the two years
- 90% attendance is a major part of this course
- Work experience every Friday

# Credits awarded for the following elements:

- External examiner interviews covering specific task
- Continuous assignments
- Attendance/Participation
- Final Exams

Satisfactory completion of Modules 62 credits (31%)

7 Student tasks 70 credits (35%)

Final examinations 68 credits (34%)

Total 200 credits (100%)

Do Leaving Certificate Applied students receive a Leaving Certificate?

 Yes. Students who successfully complete the programme receive a Leaving Certificate from the State Examinations Commission

Pass 60-69 % (120 - 139 credits)



# What is Transition Year

- Transition Year is a one year school based programme.
- It provides a bridge to enable students make the transition from Junior to Senior cycle.
- It encourages personal and social development and recognises the need for students to grow in independence.
- TY is designed to aid the transition from the more dependant learning of Junior Cycle to the more independent self-directed learning required for the Senior Cycle.

### Aims of Transition Year

Education for MATURITY with emphasis on social awareness & increased social competence

Education through experience of *ADULT*& *WORKING LIFE*as a basis for personal development & maturity

Promotion of general, technical and academic *SKILLS* with an emphasis on interdisciplinary and self-directed learning

### Benefits of Transition Year

- Make more informed subject choices for Senior Cycle
- The chance to catch up or fill in gaps
- Practice meeting deadlines for assessments
- Make new friends & refine teamwork skills
- Take on new challenges and experiences
- Develop better links in the local community

- Positive impact on a students Leaving Certificate performance - On average a TY graduate will achieve 26 more CAO points
- Enhances the students capacity to navigate senior cycle effectively
- On average a TY graduate will <u>achieve</u>26 more CAO points
- On average a repeat student gains <u>only 5</u> <u>extra points</u>
- TY graduates are more likely to progress to higher education
- Positive impact on student personal development

# <u>Is Transition Year suited to everyone?</u>

- All students can benefit from the Transition Year Programme
- However what you get out of TY depends hugely on the attitude he/she takes to it in the first place.
- An open minded motivated individual with the courage to grasp the opportunities afforded to them will gain most from the year.
- What you get out of TY is Heavily dependant on what you are prepared to put into it.
