The Active Consent program believes that the most effective form of consent education supports young people's sexual health and agency and is taught through a sex-positive lens which honour's peoples' choices, whether they choose to become sexually active or not.

Parents/guardians play a critical role in teaching their children about consent. Speaking openly and honestly with your children can help them develop healthy relationships with others as they grow up.

Your son / daughter may wish to talk about these topics at home and you are best placed to address any concerns they may have.
