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Dear Parents and Staff,

The Department of Public Health has been notified of a case of mumps in a student attending Scoil Dara, Kilcock.

Mumps is a viral infection. Symptoms include fever, headache, and swelling of cheek and jaw. More rarely, meningitis, encephalitis and deafness can occur. People are infectious for up to 7 days before the cheek swelling appears and remain highly infectious for 5 days after the swelling started.

To prevent the spread of mumps we recommend that students:

- **should be vaccinated appropriately with two MMR vaccines.**
- **who develop symptoms of mumps be excluded from school for 5 days following the onset of swelling and**
- **are advised to telephone their General Practitioner for advice on management.**

Students that have not received two doses of the MMR vaccine, or are unsure of their vaccination status, and have not had mumps are advised to attend their GP for vaccination.

The MMR is available free of charge.
